Roadworks starting in your area soon

What's happening, where and when?

What: Road Reconstruction and Carriageway Resurfacing

Where: Grosvenor Street West between Sheepcote Street and Rawlins Street (extends map shown overleaf)

When: Commencing Thursday 29/07/2023, due to end 01/09/2023

How long: 5 weeks

Traffic Management: 24-hour Full Road Closure

Working Hours: 06:00hrs to 22:00hrs

Consideration given to residents' needs.

Site Safety: When safe to do so we will maintain access to your property, but you may experience some delay for safety reasons. Please be patient with Traffic Management Staff.

Diversion: This will be signposted locally and is also shown on the map overleaf

- 29th Jul to 12th Aug** - Sheepcote Street to just before Ryland Street
- 10th to 13th Aug** – First half of Ryland Street Junction
- 13th to 18th Aug** - Ryland Street Junction (second half) to multistorey carpark entrance
- 19th to 23rd Aug** - Multistorey Entrance to Friston Avenue including Junction.

Excavation and laying of a temporary road surface will occur on the above dates for the sections shown so **access to vehicles will not be possible during these dates.**

The top surface of Tarmac will be laid over 2 days when access to vehicles will again not be possible: -

- 29th Aug** – from Sheepcote St to Ryland St
- 30th Aug** – from Ryland St to Rawlins St.

Please do not use Browning Street or Ryland Street as a through-route



Parking and Property Access

Access to your property will be restricted. We must ask that vehicles are not parked on the road or pavement during the works.

Vehicles obstructing our works may be relocated to an adjacent, or nearby street by our chosen recovery agent, with no charge. Please contact our Public Liaison Officer on the below number if your vehicle has been removed. We understand that vehicle access may be essential for some medical & personal reasons.

If you need to get a vehicle to your property during these works, please ask our personnel on site or call our Public Liaison Officer **Dave Horner** on **07592 588089**. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

The deep construction required to fully replace the failed surfacing and the specification required to achieve a lasting solution requires significant time & effort. Exact dates are shown on the front page.

We have taken the decision to fully close the road in the interest of public safety due to the depth of excavation. We are very conscious of the impact of this closure and aim to keep traffic and neighbourhood disruption to a minimum. Every effort will be made to work as quickly as possible and reopen the road at the earliest opportunity.

We hope this information is helpful and we apologise for any inconvenience these essential works may cause. We will make every effort to minimise any unnecessary disruption. Our team on site will be ready to assist you with any issues you may have during the works and we hope you will find our employees courteous and helpful.

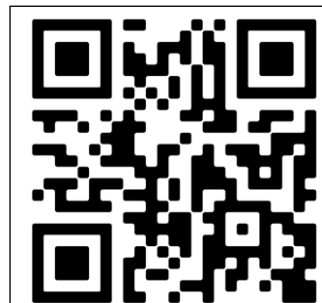
