Classic old red brick city pub to become curry house

A BIRMINGHAM city centre pub that was considered well past its "Golden Years" is celebrating the arrival of new owners as Peaky Blinders is set to reopen as an Indian restaurant.

The Bulls Head, a listed building built in 1881, will become the Pig and Gill when it reopens its doors in 2024.

The first restaurant in its Bahagpore Street, just around the corner from Cannonville, in Broad Street, where Peaky Blinders had its original base premises in October 2017.

The pub was transformed into The Curzon for a BBC, photo-still making a new series of Screen Knight's Birmingham-based dramas.

Back in December 2016, developers to reopen the Bulls Head, the first pub under that brand in 30 years. But it could open in February 2023 and has been closed ever since.

For the Pig and Gill, the venue will serve 'great grub' and 'colossal curries' according to signs in the window. On the website, the restaurant says: "A vibrant Indian restaurant is now giving Birmingham with its presence. And ignites a sensory journey through India's diverse cultural landscapes, providing an unforgettable dining experience for Birmingham's food enthusiasts."

The Bulls Head was designed by architect James & Carter Ltd, transforming into the City Taverns in the early 1980s. It has been grade II listed since 1986.

Mike Oddy, general manager of Riverside PLC, said: "It is a delight to be welcoming The Bulls Head back to Peaky Blinders trading business, which under its new name of the Pig and Gill. What a wonderful addition to the area this will be in 2024."

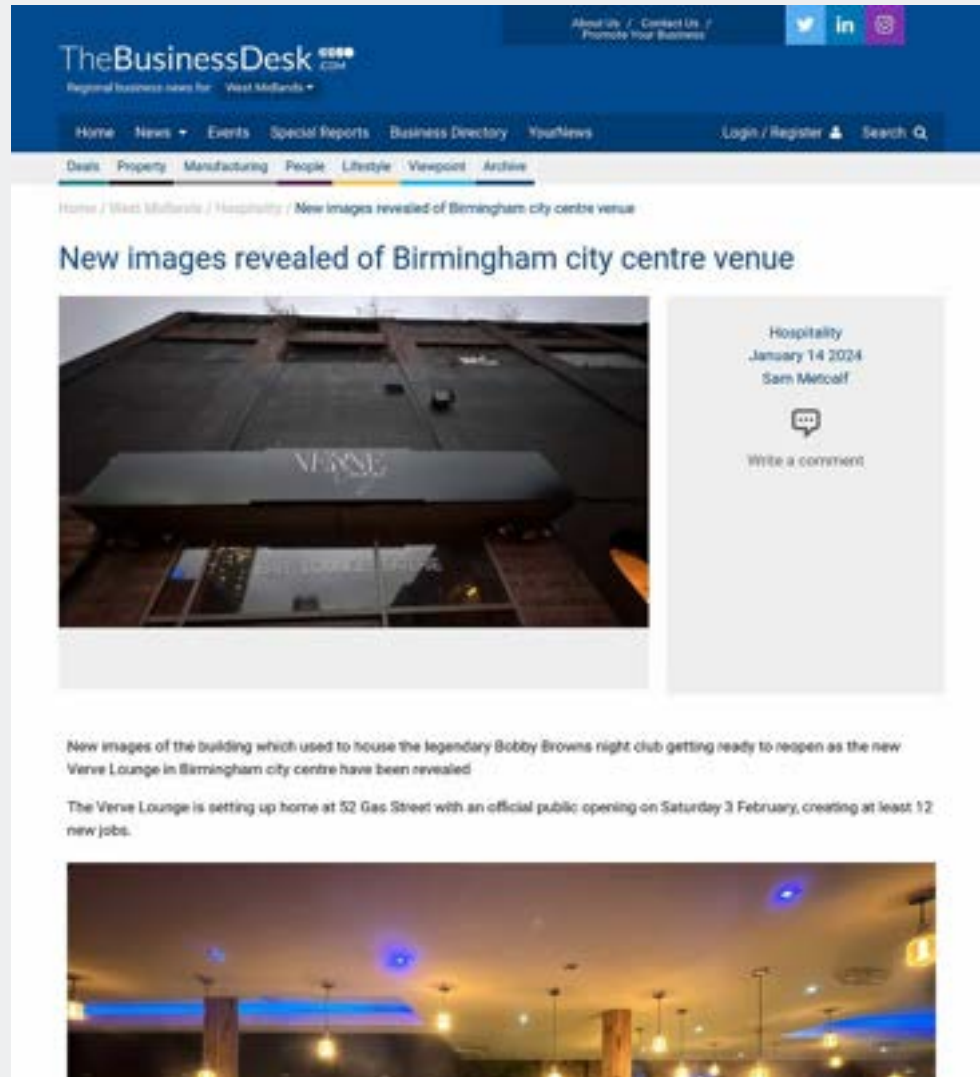

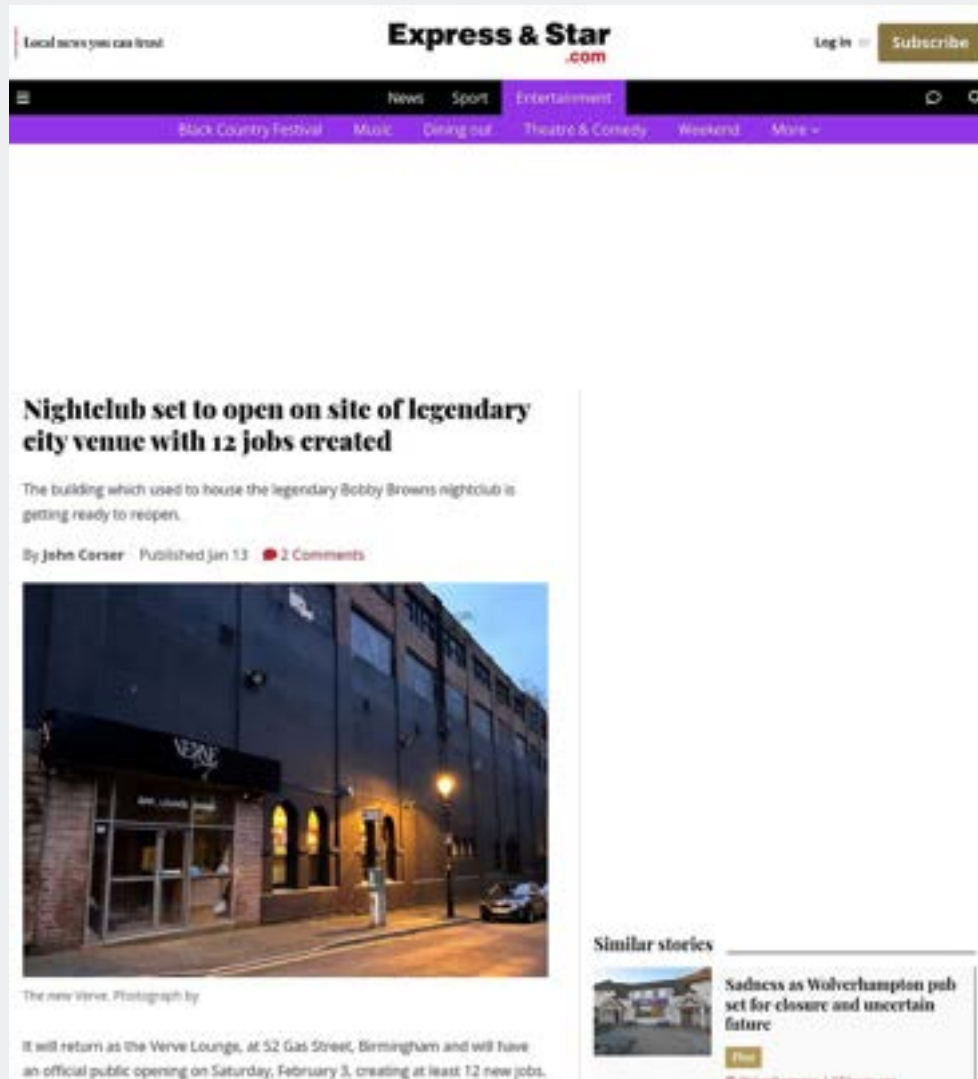

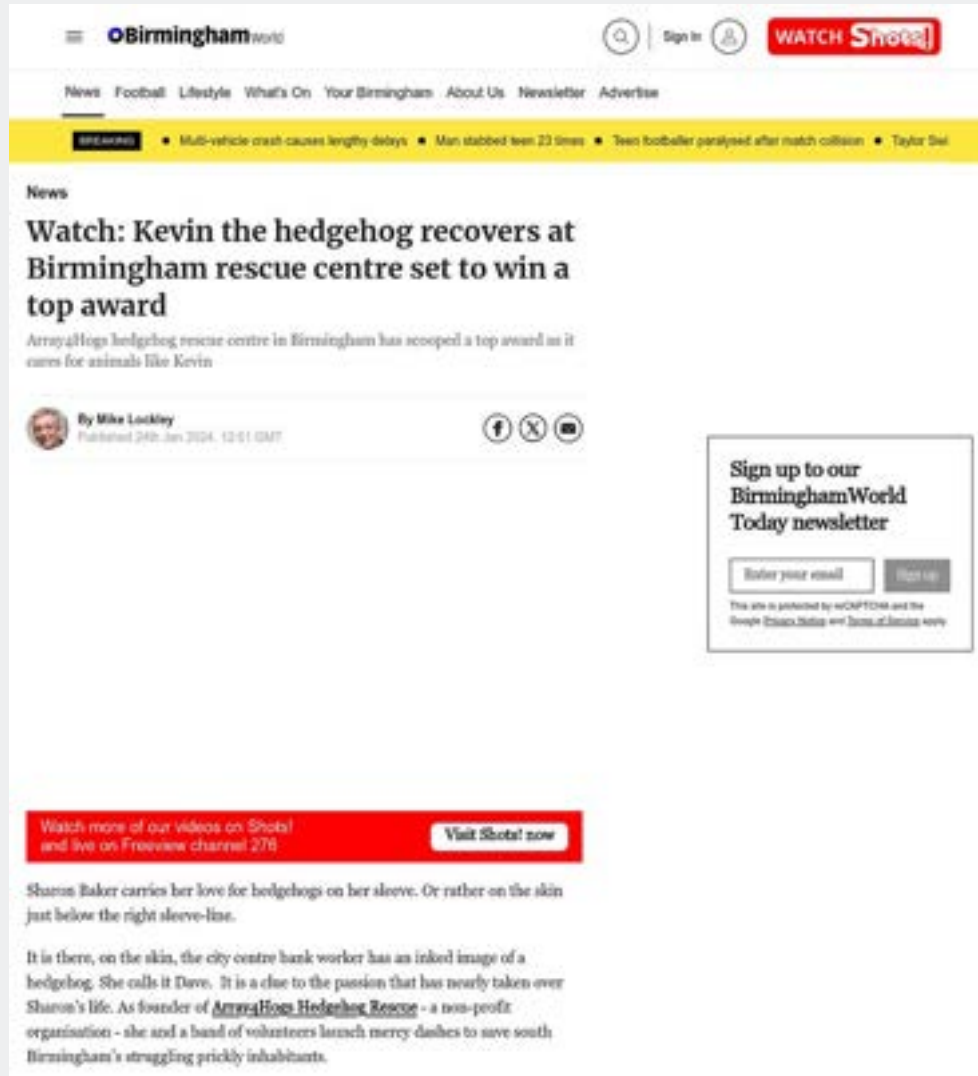

Safety fears were expressed after police were said to have been unable to access CCTV camera feeds covering **Bread Street** and other parts of **Birmingham city centre**. It was claimed a technical issue led to 90 per cent of the city council's live video surveillance not being accessible last weekend.

An upgrade to improve the quality of **Birmingham City Council's** camera network was blamed for the problem. The council said the planned disruption was linked to how live CCTV feeds were transmitted. It insisted citizens and businesses should be reassured that the city's CCTV network remained fully operational, with cameras fully monitored 24/7.
